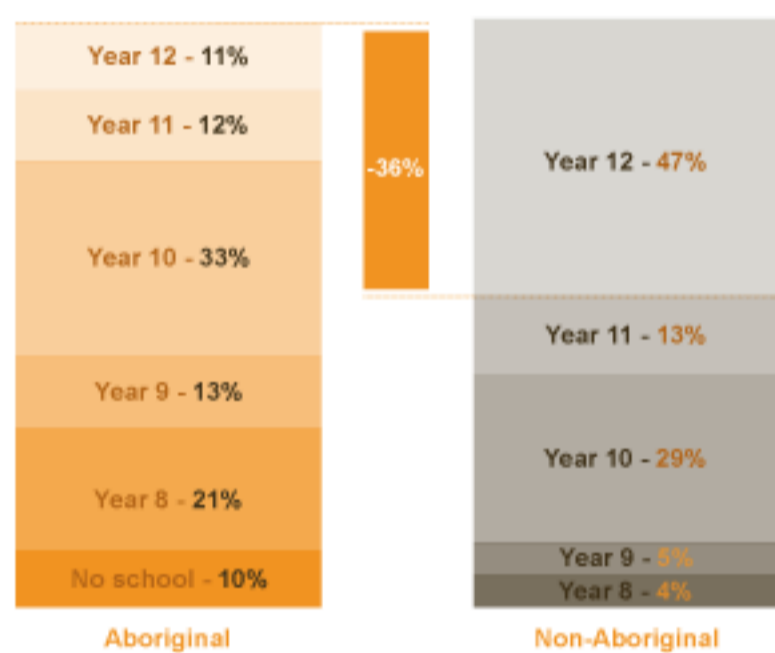

Opportunities for Halls Creek Kids - Dural Excellence Program

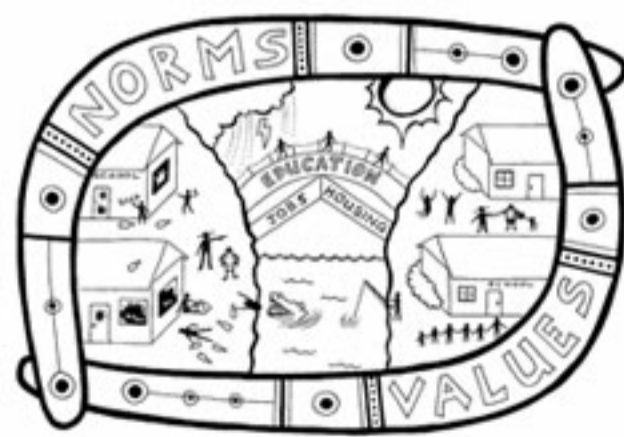
