Welcome to the June 2019 Pathways

The last few months have seen lots of activity and positive results from Wunan's activities, the re-election of the Federal Government last month provides Wunan with clarity around the strategies we need to adopt in our programs moving forward. Wunan is actively involved in contributing to strategies to alleviate some of the challenges and issues our communities of Kununurra and Halls Creek are facing.

Our PaCE team is working well with families in Kununurra and Wunan staff are working with other community groups such as the Chamber of Commerce and businesses in town to engage with the children on a weekly basis through a community-driven BBQ with a focus on building relationships between businesses and the children who are constantly roaming and offending against our businesses.

Wunan is excited to again be hosting the East Kimberley Aboriginal Achievement Awards (or EKAAAs) again this year. This year's event is planned for August 17th at the Kununurra Picture Gardens and we are very excited at the prospect of receiving a wide range of nominations for the Awards, so please remember to nominate those people you feel should be recognised for the work they do in our communities. The Jawun program is entering its tenth year in the East Kimberley, over this time Jawun has co-ordinated 442 secondees into the region to work on a variety of programs and projects with a variety of partner organisations, this has been an investment that equates to \$20.6M worth of hours contributed to our region by corporate Australia.

The Jawun Executive visits have been held regularly and provide the decision makers of corporate Australia with a better insight into the needs of our communities through partner organisations like Wunan. There have been twelve Executive visits to the region, the latest visit has just been hosted between the 2nd - 4th June.

Wunan is continuing the process of recruiting a new CEO after Jim Lewis had to stand down last year due to health reasons. We are looking forward to announcing an appointment to this critical role in Wunan very soon.

It is very rewarding to see positive changes in our community as a result of our teams and their dedication to building the capability of Aboriginal people in the Kimberley.

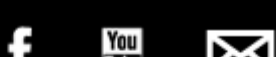
