## Housing & Accommodation



*Wunan believes that stable accommodation, along with a real job and a good education for children, are the keys to Aboriginal empowerment in the East Kimberley.*

*Wunan provides a range of supported housing alternatives to provide Aboriginal people with pathways from welfare to work so that they can build an independent future for themselves and their families.*

### East Kimberley Transitional Housing

Transitional Housing provides stable, supported housing to assist Aboriginal people to develop independent lives and save for their own home.

The program provides a range of support services to tenants, including advice on budgeting, positive lifestyles and home maintenance.

The program has been an outstanding success in Kununurra and Halls Creek, with several individuals and families already having made the transition into building or buying their own homes.

To be a successful applicant, you must meet the following conditions and be willing to make the transition into self-sufficiency and independence:

-  Be in consistent and stable employment or paid training
-  Ensure your children are attending school
-  Be committed to Wunan's support program
-  Look after your house and pay your rent



### Burralluba Workers' Hostel, Halls Creek

Burralluba Workers Hostel in Halls Creek provides supportive accommodation for Aboriginal people and families who are in work or training.

It provides a stable base for people to begin to build a positive and independent future and become role models for others in their communities.
